MINUTES OF THE NOVEMBER 10, 2010 MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

CALL TO ORDER:

President Ramsey called the meeting to order at 7:31 p.m. and noted that all Directors were present.

APPROVAL OF CONSENT ITEMS:

President Ramsey called for approval of the consent calendar (items 3, 4, 5 & 6) consisting of adoption of the October 13, 2010 minutes, approval of the October 2010 incident activity report, approval of the monthly A/P voucher #5, and the September/October 2010 monthly financial report. Director Michael made a motion to accept the consent calendar items 3, 4, 5 and 6 as presented. Director Blaschczyk seconded the motion.

VOTE: Ayes – Blaschczyk, Dommer, Kosel, Michael, Ramsey Noes – None

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS:

Joan Gallegos asked Chief Maples if PG&E had informed him of the whereabouts of gas lines in Kensington and El Cerrito. Maples responded that the Fire Department is on PG&E's wait list. There is a PG&E representative for each area of the County. The reps are meeting with government groups that request a meeting and there is currently a list. Maples said that the Department's research at this time shows there is only one large scale transmission line that runs down Carlson Blvd. in Richmond/El Cerrito into Adams Street and Albany. That is the closest line of a similar size to the San Bruno incident to Kensington and El Cerrito. Maples said PG&E is under a lot of pressure now to disclose pipe locations and they are trying to be as forthcoming as possible. Maples thinks there will be more public mapping of utilities in the future. Maples recently attended a pipeline group informational meeting in Antioch. There is no prediction of when they will determine what happened in San Bruno.

Director Dommer announced they he has decided to step down from his position on the Board and that December 2010 would be his last meeting. Dommer said he has been on the Board for 14 years, has had a great time serving, and there have also been a lot of challenges. He has enjoyed working with the Board members and fire staff. Dommer believes it is simply time for him to move on and he has other things he needs to accomplish at this time. President Ramsey said Dommer's resignation is a huge loss to the Board. The Board members thanked him for his service to the community.

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT:

Chief Maples commented on his Chief's report published in the Board packet that chronicled the two Building E fires. KPPCSD has since installed lights and security cameras on the building which Engine 65 assisted them with.

El Cerrito passed a seven year measure for a ½ cent sales tax by 58%. The City is hoping that during the 7 years the economy and housing market will have recovered enough to replace the temporary tax. The City is happy and will be able to continue to honor current employee contracts, etc.

Station 72's new Type I engine went into service last week. The El Cerrito-Kensington fleet has never been better including all staff vehicles.

LAFCO had another meeting today and discussed the fire agency service reports. They talked about trying to set short, medium and long-term goals according to LAFCO for the fire agencies. The main focus was on the jurisdictions that are in trouble such as Pinole and East Contra Costa County and those areas' options. Both Contra Costa Fire and East Contra Costa Fire are considering parcel taxes for the next election. Both agencies believe they will need to close stations if they do not pass parcel taxes. Both of these situations are receiving media coverage. Maples will continue to monitor all developments since each jurisdiction's health affects auto and mutual aid.

The annual El Cerrito-Richmond-Kensington Fire Department toy drive kicked-off last week. The 2010 goal is to serve 1,700 families. KFPD's pasta dinner/toy drive was not held due to the anticipated construction.

There is a level 3 shelter-in-place in the County tonight because of a refinery fire.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

Ramsey reported that she spoke on the District's behalf at the annual KIC meeting. She also attended the Kensington Public Safety Council meeting earlier in the week. B/C Gibson also attended the KPSC meeting to give an update on CERT. KPSC discussed items such as organizing neighborhoods and a "toolbox" for disasters.

OLD BUSINESS:

KFPD Policy Handbook Review and Updates: Director Ramsey noted the mark-ups of the existing Handbook that were included in the Board packet. The Board discussed the current mark-up of the Mission Statement and the El Cerrito Purpose Statement, and decided to adopt the Purpose Statement as KFPD's own Mission Statement. Director Kosel and Chief Maples each noted one typographical error in the text of the proposed changes to the Policy Handbook. Director Blaschczyk noted two inconsistencies on page 3 that need to be corrected. Director Ramsey made a motion to adopt the Policy Handbook as amended tonight. Director Dommer seconded the motion. Joan Gallegos asked for and received a clarification regarding Policy 1040.20.

Status of Performance Bond Claim Against Financial Pacific Insurance Company: Navellier reported that she has filed a claim letter with Financial Pacific Insurance Co. and a copy was included in the packet. The District has received receipt of delivery so the claim is now in the insurance company's possession. Mack5 is continuing to work with Swinerton, as Director Dommer reported last month, and they are to submit a bid on the project by the end of this week.

BOARD REPORTS:

<u>Finance Committee:</u> No meeting until December/January for the mid-year budget review and after the December property tax cash conversion. The Committee will be watching the revenue trend closely.

Emergency Preparedness Committee: Ramsey reported that she and Blaschczyk have talked and they are trying to coordinate the four members. John Stein of KPPCSD will no longer be on that Board and he was one of the four members. Hopefully the Committee will meet later this month.

Contra Costa County Special Districts Association: Ramsey attended the October 22nd meeting in Pleasant Hill. The County Administrator was the speaker for the meeting and he discussed the State and County economic situation. The Board briefly discussed the open LAFCO position and who will possibly be the new representative.

Diablo Fire Safe Council: DFSC will be having their second annual event celebrating the partnership between DFSC, KFPD and EBRPD and the work that is being done by the neighbors through DFSC and PG&E grants along the interface. The event will take place on Sunday, November 21st at 2:00 p.m. Fire Marshal/DFSC Board member Michael Bond will attend along with the engine company. DFSC Director and Lake Avenue resident Wood made sure to extend an invitation to each of the Board members. President Ramsey will use the opportunity to honor the neighbors that have worked so hard on the project. Joel Koosed asked for the location of the event.

CALL TO ORDER:

President Ramsey called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. at the Public Safety Building and noted that all Directors were present except for Director Michael who is expected.

OATH OF OFFICE:

Administrator Navellier administered the Oath of Office to Helmut Blaschczyk, Janice Kosel and Nina Harmon Ramsey. Staff and Board members congratulated the three.

APPROVAL OF CONSENT ITEMS:

President Ramsey called for approval of the consent calendar (items 4, 5 & 6) consisting of adoption of the October 27, 2010 special meeting minutes, approval of the monthly A/P voucher #6, and the October/November 2010 monthly financial report. Director Blaschczyk made a motion to accept the consent calendar items 4, 5 and 6 as presented. Director Dommer seconded the motion.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS:

None.

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT:

Chief Maples reported that there was a structure fire on December 4th in El Cerrito. He thought this would be a good reminder to everyone of the everyday circumstances of using a dryer. In this case one of the residents work up early and put a load of laundry in the dryer and went back to bed, another resident woke up to the smell of smoke, investigated and left the garage door open to the rest of the house during a fully involved working fire. The preventable cause was from the dryer—it is important to clean your lint trap, vent hose, etc. Also, there was apparel behind the dryer. The community has not had a dryer fire in 5 years. Joan Gallegos suggested dryer tips be given to the Outlook editor that was not in attendance. Director Michael arrived at the meeting.

Maples reported that the Mechanics Bank Kensington branch had a toy drive/mixer earlier this evening to benefit the Fire Department's annual toy program. The turnout was great and several Kensington businesses donated food and refreshments for the event.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

President Ramsey thanked and congratulated Director Dommer for his 14 years of service on the KFPD Board of Directors. Ramsey said Dommer leadership has been invaluable to the Board and he has served Kensington well. The Board members all clapped and thanked Dommer.

Ramsey suggested that the District provide year-of-end catered dinners to the firefighters under the Employee Appreciation line item budget. There would be three dinners, one for each shift. The Board concurred it was a good idea.

NEW BUSINESS:

Resolution 10-08 Supporting KIC's Efforts to Maintain and Rehabilitate Walking Paths in Kensington: KIC member, Bryce Nesbitt, stated he has volunteered to coordinate an effort to revitalize the pathways in Kensington. Nesbitt passed around a copy of a 1912 subdivision map of the Berkeley Highlands. The developer offered to grant all paths, boulevards and roads to the public good and the County Supervisors rejected the grant in whole. Nesbitt said the paths have been a murky legal status since. The Kensington Improvement Club has volunteered to maintain the paths and make physical improvements Nesbitt said the City of Berkeley has listed and prioritized their paths in terms of emergency access. Kensington has 14 paths. KIC is currently constructing improvements to #11 path off of Cambridge. The four neighbors at that location are helpful and supportive. Two of the paths of the 14 have been blocked. The one by 257 Arlington has a fence and an outbuilding built on it. KIC has determined that they do not need permission to work on the paths since there is no property owner and the County is not taking responsibility. The County has just recently offered to put up street signs for the paths. Joe deVille asked about the liability since some of the paths have utilities. Nesbitt responded that they have always telephoned before digging and that Stege Sanitary has also passed a resolution in support of KIC's efforts. Utility easements don't necessarily affect the ownership of the property. Further discussion on the improvements and naming of the paths followed. Director Kosel made a motion to enact Resolution 10-08. Director Michael seconded the motion.

Additional Services Request #5 in a Not-to-Exceed Amount of \$9,200 from Mack5 for Preconstruction Management Services: Director Blaschczyk asked if the bond surety company would pick up some of these costs since they are being incurred because of Kel-Tec's bankruptcy. Navellier said the District would make a claim for Mack5 and legal counsel's time. Director Dommer said Mack5 is doing a very good job trying to manage the bond company's process and represent the District's interest. It is Dommer's hope that the bond company will honor the tender process, pay the District the difference and let the District proceed with the building project. The bond company put the project out to bid with a start date of January 3rd which is unrealistic due to the weather. The bond company is obligated to have the project completed so there will be some negotiation if the bids come in much higher than Kel-Tec's bid. Legal counsel believes we should be reimbursed for Mack5's time and their time during this part of the process. Director Dommer made a motion to approve the request for additional services from Mack5 in the amount not-to-exceed \$9,200. Director Ramsey seconded the motion.

<u>Election of Officers for Calendar Year 2011:</u> Director Ramsey opened the nominations for President of the Board. Ramsey nominated Director Kosel. Director Michael seconded the motion. No other nominations were made.

Director Ramsey opened the nominations for Vice President of the Board and nominated Director Blaschczyk. Director Michael seconded the motion. No other nominations were made.

VOTE: Ayes – Blaschczyk, Dommer, Kosel, Michael, Ramsey Noes – None

Director Ramsey opened the nominations for Secretary and nominated Director Michael. Director Dommer seconded the motion. No other nominations were made.

VOTE: Ayes -- Blaschczyk, Dommer, Kosel, Michael, Ramsey Noes -- None

OLD BUSINESS:

Status of Performance Bond Claim Against Financial Pacific Insurance Company: Navellier reported that the current status continues to develop. She has filed a claim letter with Financial Pacific Insurance Co. and received a reply on November 11th which was included in the Board packet. FPIC has hired a consultant to rebid the project and legal counsel to represent them. Mack5 is continuing to work on the process and insist upon a tender agreement as opposed to the tri-party agreement that FPIC's consultant listed in his bid package. Our legal counsel has spoken to FPIC's counsel who loosely committed to a tender agreement. The bid due date is the 16th of December. The District's architect is on a preplanned trip out of town so some of the insurance company's requests for information are not able to be answered during the short bid time frame that their consultant chose. The insurance company will forward the bid tabulation to KFPD. Navellier believes three contractors are currently planning on bidding the process. KFPD has insisted that any contractor chosen should have to submit to the prequalification process that the Board adopted by resolution. Director Dommer gave a brief recap of the project, the permit process, the prequalification of contractors, bid award and bankruptcy of Kel-Tec for the benefit of those in the audience who were not aware of the project.

BOARD REPORTS:

<u>Finance Committee:</u> No meeting until January for the mid-year budget review which will be presented to the Board at the February meeting.

<u>Emergency Preparedness Committee:</u> Ramsey reported the Committee still has not met and doesn't expect to until after the beginning of the year.

<u>California Special Districts Association:</u> 2010 Accomplishments and Board training offered in 2011 were included in the packet.

Diablo Fire Safe Council/Hills Emergency Forum: Directors Ramsey and Blaschczyk, and fire staff attended the second annual Lake neighborhood event celebrating the right-of-entry work and the partnership between DFSC, KFPD and EBRPD. The event was well attended with about 65 people. Ramsey honored the neighbors that have been working in the area with KFPD hats. Maples hopes a right-of-entry permit can be accomplished for the entire Kensington/El Cerrito interface. DFSC has \$5,000 block grants available to neighborhood groups who apply and arrange for additional work to be done under the right-of-entry permit. Three have been awarded to neighbors in the Lake Drive/Grizzly Peak area, one to Camp Herms, and one to a group on Balra in El Cerrito. The next award date is in January 2011.

HEF has put together some wildfire evacuation tip brochures that were included in the packet. Navellier will have them put on the District's website. It took HEF nearly six months to complete the brochures. Their staff drafted them and sent them to all of the member fire agencies for input and review.

Bryce Nesbitt suggested having the County put a path sign along the interface also. The Eagle Scouts are interested in working on the path between Hilltop School and Kensington Ct. Nesbitt will follow-up with EBRPD.

Director Dommer said he would like to thank the other members of the Board. Overall it was a great time, not without some challenges, but an excellent experience to serve on the Board. Dommer said during his 14 years he has appreciated working with the fire staff, the different chiefs including Chief Maples, and also Navellier for over 11 years. Maples said as his Fire Chief, he has really appreciated working with Dommer and his efforts to make KFPD a better place for the staff to work. Joan Gallegos agreed Dommer has done a great job.

Navellier said that she will notify the County of Dommer's resignation, post the open position, and the District has 60 days to appoint a replacement. The Board discussed appointing in January then expressed an interest in February. There was no announcement in the December/January Outlook and the Outlook is not published again until February. Navellier will contact the County to check the dates and put a posting on the website.

ADJOURNMENT:	The meeting was adjourned at 8:22 p.m.


Incident Activity Reports for the Month of November 2010





PG&E Gas Line Update

The Fire Department recently met with Tom Guarino and John Corona from PG&E concerning the natural gas lines that are located in and near El Cerrito and Kensington. The meeting was very informative and a lot of questions from those that attended were answered. Below are the key points that were brought up and discussed during this meeting.

High Pressure Transmission Lines:

In PG&E's vernacular, a high pressure system is any gas line above 60 psi. In reality they operate between 100 psi to 1,000 psi depending on the type of lines and location. These lines can be any size from 4" to 42" in diameter and are typically constructed of steel with cathode protection. PG&E has almost 6,500 miles of high pressure transmission lines in their system which is broke down into 20,000 segments for tracking and planning purposes. The only high pressure line in El Cerrito or Kensington is on the southwest side of El Cerrito along Carlson Boulevard from El Dorado Street to the Alameda County line. The line continues northwest towards Chevron by going under Interstate 80 near Burlingame Avenue and continues south into Albany.

This line was installed in 1947 and is 24" in diameter. This segment's designator is line 105A. It is a steel line and is rated for a maximum safe working pressure of 275 psi although its normal operating pressure is 150 psi. For a comparison, the line that ruptured in San Bruno was also 24" in diameter that was installed in the early 1950's and had a maximum safe working pressure of 400 psi but normally operated at 300 psi. While the pressures and flows in this line are monitored 24 hours a day, there are no automatic or remote controlled shut off valves.

PG&E stated that every mile of their transmission lines are inspected every year in one form or another. Some are done with internal sensors that are sent down the line and the rest is visual either from the air or driving and looking for any construction or changes in the areas. Once every five years every inch of the pipe line is walked on the surface by a team using very sensitive gas detectors looking for possible leaks. The portion of the gas line that does pass under El Cerrito is considered a "High Concentration Area" (HCA) which is defined as any area in a 200 yard radius of the transmission line that could be a potential high casualty area should a problem such as San Bruno occur. HCA's are based on the number of people that could be affected. Typically this would be schools of any type, shopping centers (El Cerrito Plaza) or

large apartment buildings (mid to high rise). HCA lines are inspected/checked more often than non-HCA transmission lines. Line 105A is not on the top 100 segments of lines that PG&E has planned for replacement or upgrade.

Main Lines:

Main lines are any pipes that operate at or below 60 psi and are fed or supplied from a transmission line. They can again be a number of sizes from 2" to 24" but are typically in the 6" to 12" size. While they will have customer hook ups, their main purpose is to feed the distribution lines. In El Cerrito and Kensington there is only one main line that runs down San Pablo Avenue. This line which is an early 1960's vintage is 8" in diameter, constructed of steel and runs at 50 psi. Like the transmission lines it is protected by a cathode grid. Main lines are physically checked every 5 years by sub-contractors walking the streets with gas detectors.

Distribution Lines:

Distribution lines are basically the same as main lines other than they are typically smaller in size and are supplied by the main line. These are the lines that are under almost every street in this area and have the customer hook ups coming off of them. In El Cerrito and Kensington these lines run at 50 psi also and decrease slightly with distance and elevation. The majority of the distribution lines are steel and are of the same 1960 vintage aside from any new streets or developments since the mid 1970's when they started using polypropylene (plastic) lines. Both Tom and John stated though that depending on where the new lines were installed, PG&E may still have used steel to keep the grounding and cathode protection connected. As with the main lines, the distribution lines are physically checked every five years by sub-contractors walking the streets with gas detectors.

General Information:

Compared to the gas line pressures in the streets, the pressure after the gas meter and regulator is normally less than 1/4 psi going into the customers home or business. Contrary to some of the information that came out after the San Bruno incident, all natural gas in PG&E's lines is odorized for the ability to smell if there is a leak.

While PG&E left a couple of maps with us, they are asking that they not be distributed to the public for safety reasons as these maps show the exact location of their valves, pressure regulators, etc. In the near future they are going to be releasing GIS maps to public safety groups for use in emergency planning. They believe that it will be of a format that the Fire Department will be able to down load the maps onto their vehicle laptops to use for reference.

PG&E's planned goals for the next 10 years are documented in their Pipeline 2020 Program. These include:

- Modernize critical pipeline infrastructure
- Expand the use of automatic or remote controlled shut-off valves
- Spur the development of next-generation inspection technologies
- Develop industry-leading best practices
- · Enhance public safety partnerships

PG&E currently offers a service to any homeowner that is concerned about their gas lines or their proximity to a transmission line and this can be accessed by them calling 1-888-PGE-PGE1

While there is always potential for a catastrophic problem such as that in San Bruno, PG&E feels that El Cerrito and Kensington have an extremely low probability for anything of that magnitude. I trust that this information answers a number of questions surrounding PG&E. Please do not hesitate to contact the Fire Department with any other questions.

Employee Status

POLICY NUMBER:

100

100.10 A "Regular" employee is one who has been hired to fill a regular position in any job classification and has completed his/her probationary period.

100.20 A "Probationary" employee is one who has been hired to fill a regular position in any job classification and has less than three (3) continuous months of service with the District. Upon completion of three (3) months of continuous service with the District in said classification, and upon the Board of Director's decision to retain said employee, said employee shall be granted regular employee status.

POLICY TITLE:

Vehicle Cost Reimbursement

POLICY NUMBER:

110

110.10 When an employee is authorized to use his/her personal vehicle in the performance of District work, he/she shall be reimbursed for the cost of said use on the basis of total miles driven and at the rate specified in the Internal Revenue Service Guidelines in effect at the time of said usage.

110.20 Proof of adequate insurance covering collision, personal injury and property damage shall be required by the District of any employee using a personal vehicle in the performance of District work.

POLICY TITLE:

Educational Assistance

POLICY NUMBER:

120

120.10 Employees of the District are encouraged to pursue educational opportunities which are related to their present work.

120.20 To be eligible for reimbursement of course costs, the employee must receive advance approval for the class(es) from the Board of Directors. Requests for reimbursement should be submitted in writing. The employee will be notified of final approval, or the reasons for disapproval.

Pay Periods

POLICY NUMBER:

130

130.10 The salaries and wages of all District employees shall be paid semi-monthly, being two business days after the 15th day and two business days after the last day of every month.

POLICY TITLE:

Performance Evaluation

POLICY NUMBER:

140

140.10 This policy shall apply to all employees.

140.20 An employee may raise any employment concern with any member of the Board.

140.30 The President or his/her designated representative shall conduct a scheduled performance review of each employee annually.

140.40 Performance evaluations shall be in writing by the President in consultation with the Board. Said evaluation shall provide recognition for effective performance and also identify areas which need improvement.

140.50 The performance evaluation shall be signed by the evaluator and shall be discussed with the employee.

POLICY TITLE:

Drug and Alcohol Abuse

POLICY NUMBER:

150

150.10 It is the desire of the Board of Directors that all work environments of District Employees be safe and productive and free of the influence of drugs, alcohol and/or other controlled substances. The Board of Directors is concerned with the physical safety of all employees, potential damage to property and equipment, mental and physical health of employees, productivity and work quality, medical insurance costs, and the harm done to employees and their families by the inappropriate use of controlled substances.

- 150.20 The use (except as prescribed by a physician), sale, possession, purchase or transfer of drugs, alcohol and/or other controlled substances by any District employee or officer on District property or work sites or while said employee or officer is on District business is prohibited.
- 150.21 Employees are also prohibited from being under the influence of drugs, alcohol and/or other controlled substances during hours of work where such substances could impair the fitness of an employee to perform his/her work.
- 150.22 Commission of any of the actions described above will subject the employee to disciplinary action up to and including termination.
- 150.23 For the purpose of applying this policy, being under the influence of drugs, alcohol and/or other controlled substances means being impaired in any way from fully and proficiently performing job duties and/or having a detectable amount of said substances in one's body.

POLICY TITLE:

Use of Tobacco Products Within the District

POLICY NUMBER:

160

160.10 Ample research exists demonstrating the health hazards of the use of tobacco products, including smoking and the breathing of second-hand smoke. Therefore, in the best interest of the health and safety of employees and the general public, the smoking of tobacco products shall be banned completely within District buildings or confined spaces, or in District vehicles.

- 160.11 The successful implementation of this policy depends upon the thoughtfullness, consideration and cooperation of smokers and non-smokers. All individuals on District premises share in the responsibility of adhering to this policy.
- 160.20 All District employees will be responsible for advising members of the public who are observed smoking tobacco products on District property of the District's policy on the matter. Said individuals shall be asked by staff to refrain from smoking.
- 160.21 Members of the public who refuse to comply with this policy may be directed to leave District property.

Harassment

POLICY NUMBER:

170

170.10 The Kensington Fire Protection District is committed to providing a work environment for its employees that is free of harassment. The District prohibits sexual harassment and harassment because of race, religious creed, color, national origin or ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition, marital status, age, sexual orientation or any other basis protected by federal, state or local law, ordinance or regulation. This policy applies to all persons involved in the operation of the District and prohibits harassment by any employee of the District.

170.20 Sexual Harrassment Definition Examples, Sexual harassment manifests itself in many forms. The following are a few examples of sexual harassment:

170.21 Written: sexually suggestive or obscene letters, notes or invitations.

170.22 Verbal: sexually derogatory comments, slurs, jokes, remarks or epithets.

170.23 Visual: leering, making sexual gestures, or displaying sexually suggestive objectives, pictures, cartoons or posters.

170.24 Physical: assault, attempted rape, impeding or blocking movement, or touching.

170.25 Other:

170.251 Sexual advances which are unwanted (this may include situations which began as reciprocal attractions, but later ceased to be reciprocal).

170.252 Employees who are subjected to hazing (this may include being dared or asked to perform unsafe work practices, having tools and equipment stolen, etc.) if requests for sexual favors are not met.

170.253 Employment benefits affected in exchange for sexual favors (may include situations where an individual is treated less favorably because others have acquiesced to sexual advances).

170.254 Implying or actually withholding support for appointment, promotion, transfer or change of assignment; or initiating a rejection on probation or adverse action; or suggesting that a poor performance report will be prepared if requests for sexual favors are not met.

170.255 Reprisals or threats after negative response to sexual advances.

- 170.30 Harassment because of race, religious creed, color, national origin or ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition, marital status, age, sexual orientation or any other protected basis is prohibited, including, but not limited to the following behavior:
- 170.31 Verbal conduct such as epithets, derogatory jokes or comments, slurs or unwanted sexual advances, invitations or comments;
- 170.32 Visual conduct such as derogatory and/or sexually-oriented posters, photography, cartoons, drawings or gestures;
- 170.33 Physical conduct such as assault, unwanted touching, blocking normal movement or interfering with work because of sex, race or any other protected basis; and,
 - 170.34 Retaliation for having reported or threatened to report harassment.
- 170.40 If an employee of the District believes that they have been harassed, they should provide a written complaint to any member of the Board of Directors. As soon as possible thereafter, the Board will undertake an immediate, thorough and objective investigation of the harassment allegation(s).
- 170.50 If it is determined that harassment has occurred, effective remedial action will be taken in accordance with the circumstances involved. Any employee determined to be responsible for harassment will be subjected to appropriate disciplinary action, up to and including termination.
- 170.51 Whatever action is taken against the harasser will be made known to the employee lodging the complaint, and appropriate action will be taken to remedy any loss to the employee resulting from the harassment. Retaliation against anyone filing a complaint will not be permitted or tolerated.

170.60 Employees are encouraged to immediately report any incident of harassment so that complaints can be quickly and fairly resolved.

Affirmative Action

POLICY NUMBER:

180

180.10 It is the policy of the Kensington Fire Protection District that there shall be no discrimination based upon race, national origin, religion, sex, physical handicap, veteran's status, sexual orientation, or age in any personnel action, including recruitment, appointment, performance evaluation, promotion, the granting of leaves, and any disciplinary or grievance action.

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180.20 This policy contains two major commitments:

180.21 To recognize both a moral and legal obligation to work toward a work force composition reflecting the mix of ethnic minorities and women in the labor markets from which the District draws its staff.

180.22 To make a demonstrable and deliberate effort in hiring to solicit applications from minority and women candidates in all cases where their representation is below the labor force standard.

190.10 The following measures are part of the disciplinary process: warning, reprimand, suspension with or without pay, dismissal, demotion, or reduction in pay. The President may discipline any employee for cause.

190.201 Discourteous treatment of the public or fellow employees.

190.202 Drinking of intoxicating beverages or use of illegal or nonprescribed drugs on the job, or arriving on the job under the influence of such beverages or drugs.

190.203 Habitual absence or tardiness.

190.204 Disorderly conduct.

190.205 Incompetency or inefficiency.

190.206 Being wasteful of material, property, or working time.

190.207 Violation of any lawful or reasonable regulation or order made and given by an employee's supervisor; insubordination.

190.208 Neglect of duty.

190.209 Dishonesty.

190.210 Misuse of District property.

190.211 Willful disobedience.

190.212 Conduct unbecoming a District employee.

190.30 All acts of discipline will be accompanied by a letter of warning to the employee stating the reasons and grounds for such discipline. The employee must acknowledge receipt of the warning by

signing the letter at the time of presentation; this signature signifies only receipt of the document, not necessarily agreement to the contents. The employee may, before the conclusion of the next regular working day, respond in writing to the contents of the letter of warning.

190.40 All negative evaluations or letters of warning shall remain part of the employee's personnel file. Negative evaluation shall not be used by the Board of Directors in decisions to dismiss if the performance has improved or the action which merited a warning has not recurred, each/both for a period of at least one (1) year.

POLICY TITLE:

Job Description - District Manager

POLICY NUMBER:

20(

200.10 Description. The District Manager is a full-time at will employee of the District. The District Manager's job description is reflected in the Memorandum of Understanding between the District Manager and the District which is attached to and incorporated as part of this Employee Handbook.

200.11 One-half of the annual cost of the District Manager's position is paid for by the City of El Cerrito for services rendered to the El Cerrito Fire Department.

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Deleted: The Administrator oversees the District and has exclusive management and control of the operations and works of the District, subject to approval by the Board of Directors. He'she provides day-to-day administration for the District. He'she has general charge, responsibility and control over all property of the District. He'she shall report directly to the President of the Board of Directors. A copy of the Administrator's most current Memorandum of Understanding shall be attached to this Policy.

200,11 He/she attends all meetings of the District's Board, and such other meetings as the Board specifies from time to time.

<#>The Administrator acts as District Clerk to the Board of Directors.¶

<#>The Administrator composes correspondence on own initiative; transcribes and edits minutes; prepares drafts of agenda items; gives information to organizations and the general public regarding Board matters; and, prepares correspondence and maintains files on official actions of the Board.

<#>> The Administrator, in consultation with the Finance Committee, is responsible for depositing, withdrawing, transferring and investing District funds, maintaining efficient fiscal practices to maximize non-operational earnings, and maintaining cash flow for needed liquidity.

. 200.15 He/she maintains cordial relations with all persons entitled to the services of the District, and attempts to resolve all public complaints. He/she shall encourage citizen participation in the affairs of the District.¶

200.16 He/she seeks to carry into effect the expressed policies of the Board of Directors, including the short, medium and long term work program of the District, and facilitating constructive and harmonious Board relations. He/she shall translate the goals and objectives of the Board to the community.

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Chapter 8 - Overtime

Memorandum of Understanding Between the Kensington Fire Protection District and Brenda J. Navellier, Administrator (hereinafter employee)

CHAPTER 1 - DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR JOB DESCRIPTION

The District Administrator, as sole employee of the District, is responsible for day-to-day activities of the District including but not limited to the following:

The employee provides management and administrative duties as required by daily operations in the District office. The Administrator represents the District to the public, Board members and other agencies and seeks to carry into effect the expressed policies of the Board of Directors. The Administrator serves as liaison between the Board of Directors and the Fire Chief, the members of the El Cerrito Fire Department, the City of El Cerrito, Contra Costa County, and District legal counsel.

The employee arranges meetings and conferences; prepares agendas and Board packets; posts meeting notices; attends meetings of the Board of Directors and District Committees; transcribes and edit minutes; prepares agenda items and resolutions as necessary; prepares correspondence and maintains files on official actions of the Board. The Administrator manages the District website. The employee will spend one-half of the designated work hours on the business of the Kensington Fire Protection District and one-half of the work hours on the business of the El Cerrito Fire Department. The employee may be on-call for needed staff support during and after emergencies within the Kensington Fire Protection District boundaries.

The employee processes all incoming accounts payable and receivable; reports payroll; tracks investments with the County; prepares monthly financial statements; prepares monthly transmittals; reconciles accounts; drafts the District fiscal year budget; calculates the annual appropriations limit; coordinates the health benefit program for retired employees; and works with the Districts contract accountant and the District auditor.

The employee performs all necessary procedures to assist County with District elections; placing the special tax on the tax roll; and enrollment in the County fire districts JPA meeting including attending the JPA's annual meeting.

The employee manages the District building at 217 Arlington Avenue including repairs, maintenance and capital improvement items, and acts as liaison to the District's tenant, the Kensington Community Services District.

CHAPTER 2 - HIRING DATE/IMPLEMENTATION DATE

2.1 <u>Hiring Date/Service Credit</u>

The hiring date is July 19, 1999 and service credit is recognized from the hiring date.

2.2 Agreement Implementation

The implementation of this agreement will take place on November 2009 through the end of the 2009-2010 fiscal year at which time it is subject to annual review per Section 3.1.

CHAPTER 3 - SALARY AND BENEFITS

3.1 Base Annual Salary

The following base annual salary shall apply effective the 1st day of July 2010:

District Administrator

\$5,898.04 per month

(Based on current hourly rate of \$34.03 x 40/hours week x 52 weeks)

KFPD EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK
Policy #200 - "Job Description - Administrator"

The above salary is subject to review and adjustment by the Board of Directors after an annual review to be performed by the Board President or a designated Director. The review shall be performed during the month of June and will address employee performance and job description, as well as possible salary and benefit adjustments.

The Employee will be paid twice per month as follows: two business day following the 15th of the month and two business days following the last day of the month.

3.2 Deferred Compensation

The Employee may participate in the District's Deferred Compensation Plan. The District will match Employee contributions to the Plan of up to 5% of the Employee's base annual salary per fiscal year.

3.3 Longevity Bonus

Effective fiscal year 2009-2010 and each fiscal year thereafter, the District shall make longevity bonus payments to an employee with 15 or more years of service with the District. The amount of the longevity bonus will be \$1,000 per year and will be paid on the first payroll date of August.

3.4 Medical Benefits Compensation

It is the District's intention to provide medical insurance for the employee. Since the employee is the sole employee of the District, the District opts to pay the employee a flat rate of \$400 per month of taxable income for employee to purchase medical coverage or to use for non-covered medical expenses. The employee may have alternate comprehensive group medical coverage through a spouse's medical plan or some other group medical plan.

3.5 Dental Benefits Compensation

It is the District's intention to provide dental insurance for the employee. Since the employee is the sole employee of the District, the District opts to pay the employee a flat rate of \$50 per month of taxable income for employee to purchase dental coverage or to use for non-covered dental expenses. The employee may have alternate comprehensive group dental coverage through a spouse's dental plan or some other group dental plan.

3.6 Life Insurance

The District will provide a term life insurance policy for the Employee. The principal sum shall be equal to providers' minimum policy or employee's annual salary if greater than minimum, rounded to the nearest \$1,000.

3.7 Auto Allowance Use and Reimbursement

Employees required to use their own automobiles for District business shall be reimbursed at the Internal Revenue Service allowable rate.

3.8 Benefit Status

- A. The salary and benefits contained herein are granted only to an employee who is in a current pay status. The District shall incur no cost, nor shall benefits accrue for retirees, survivors, or employees in a non-pay status, unless the employee is granted medical leave of absence or military leave of absence.
- B. In the event an employee is in a non-pay status because of a disputed workers' compensation claim, benefits under this article shall be continued upon written agreement of the affected employee to repay to the District the amount of any premiums paid by the District during the non-pay status period if the employee's claim is denied by the Workers Compensation Appeals Board or withdrawn by the employee prior to a decision by the Board.

CHAPTER 4 - HOLIDAYS

4.1 Holidays

The following holidays are recognized as District holidays for pay purposes:

New Year's Day Dr. M.L. King Jr. Birthday

(3rd Monday in January)

President's Day

(3rd Monday in February) Memorial Day

Independence Day (July 4)

Labor Day Veteran's Day

Thanksgiving

Day after Thanksgiving

Christmas Eve Day

Christmas Day

1/2 Day New Year's Eve

In the event that any of the aforementioned days falls on a Sunday, the following Monday shall be considered a holiday for pay purposes. In the event that any of the aforementioned days fall on a Saturday, the preceding Friday shall be considered a holiday for pay purposes. The afternoon of New Year's Eve, commencing at 12 noon, shall be considered a holiday for pay purposes. In the event Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve fall on a Sunday or a Monday, the preceding Friday afternoons shall be considered holidays for pay purposes.

Floating Holidays 4.2

In addition to the recognized municipal holidays, employees shall receive annually four floating holidays, subject to the same requirements for scheduling vacation under Section 6.2 of this agreement. Floating holidays must be taken during the fiscal year they are received and may not be carried over and accumulated.

4.3 Compensation for District Holidays

- If the employee is on leave-of-absence without pay, they shall not receive any compensation for holidays occurring during such leave.
- B. The employee must be in a pay status on the workday preceding a holiday to be eligible to be compensated for the holiday.

CHAPTER 5 - SICK LEAVE, WORKERS' COMPENSATION, FAMILY SICK LEAVE, AND OTHER LEAVES

Accrual of Sick Leave - Rate 5.1

The employee shall be eligible to accrue sick leave at the rate of two weeks per fiscal year. After 20 or more years of service, the employee shall accrue sick leave at the rate of three weeks per fiscal year.

Sick Leave - Maximum Accrual 5.2

The employee shall not be able to carry over more than two year's worth of sick leave (160 hours) to the following fiscal year unless authorized by the Board of Directors.

5.3 **Activity During Sick Leave**

No employee who is absent from work on sick leave shall engage in any work or other activity that would interfere with the employee's ability to return to work to perform regular duties.

Accrued Sick Leave as Life Insurance 5.4

Upon the death of the employee, the value of the employee's accrued sick leave, calculated at the employee's hourly rate, shall be paid to the employee's estate or designated beneficiary.

Workers' Compensation - Disability Payments 5.5

An employee receiving disability payments under the Workers' Compensation laws may use accumulated sick leave and vacation leave in order to maintain regular income. Under these circumstances, the employee shall be paid the difference between full salary and the disability payments received. Such sick leave and vacation leave shall be drawn in proportion to the salary payments required to provide the employee with his/her regular income. KFPD EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK

Policy #200 - "Job Description - Administrator"

5.6 Family Sick Leave

Under Labor Code 233, employees may utilize accrued sick leave to care for an ill or injured child, spouse, or parent. There is no requirement that the illness or injury reach the level of seriousness provided for under the Family and Medical Leave Acts (See Section 4.10 below). However, if the illness or injury qualifies under the Family and Medical Leave Act, it also satisfies the "family sick leave" criteria. The maximum "family sick leave" allowed each calendar year that is subject to this provision is one half (1/2) of the employee's annual accrual of sick leave.

5.7 Bereavement Leave

The employee is entitled to time off with pay when there is a death or anticipated death in the immediate family. Bereavement leave shall not exceed three consecutive days when death is anticipated. Bereavement leave after death shall not exceed that period of time between death and the day of the funeral, providing the funeral is held within five days following death. Additional time may be granted and charged as sick leave when, in the opinion of the Board President, unusual circumstances identify the need for additional time off.

Immediate family is defined as spouse, domestic partner, child, parent, parent-in-law, sister, brother, sister-in-law, brother-in-law, grandparent, spouse's grandparent, grandchild, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, or any other relative of the employee or employee's spouse residing in the same household, or who has resided with the employee in the same household for three or more years. In cases where death has occurred involving someone other than the immediate family, the Board of Directors shall make the decision as to qualification for bereavement leave.

CHAPTER 6 - VACATION

6.1 Eligibility

The employee shall be eligible to take a paid vacation at the end of the first year of continuous service, and annually thereafter.

6.2 Scheduling

The scheduling of annual vacation leave and the amount to be taken at any one time shall be determined by the employee and the Board President with regard for the needs of the District and the preference of the employee.

6.3 Vacation at Termination

Employees leaving the municipal service with accrued vacation leave shall be paid the amount of accrued vacation to the date of termination. Payment for accrued vacation shall be at the employee's current rate of pay.

6.4 Sick Leave During Vacation

Vacation leave may be converted to sick leave subject to the review and approval of the Board President if an employee is injured or sick during the vacation for a period in excess of 24 hours.

6.5 Vacation Carryover and Cash-Out

The employee shall not be able to carry over more than one year's worth of vacation days to the following fiscal year unless authorized by the Board of Directors. Employees may annually cash-out up to 10 days (80 hours) of vacation.

6.6 Accrual

Vacation leave will be accrued from the first day of employment when an employee is in a pay status and will be credited at the beginning of every fiscal year. District holidays shall not be counted during vacation.

CHAPTER 7 - WORK SCHEDULE

7.1 Workweek

The normal workweek for full-time confidential employees is 40 hours. The normal workday is 8 hours per day.

CHAPTER 8 - OVERTIME

8.1 Overtime Policy – Definition

It is the policy of the District that overtime work is to be kept at a minimum consistent with the protection of the lives and property of Kensington citizens and the efficient operation of the Kensington-El Cerrito Fire Department. Overtime must be authorized by either the Board President or the Fire Chief and is subject to such other rules and procedures as the Board of Directors may prescribe.

Overtime shall be defined as time worked beyond the hours worked in the normal workweek, defined in Section 7.1 herein as 40 hours for the employee. Hours worked are defined as all time during which an employee is necessarily required to be on the employer's premises, on duty or at a prescribed work place. Sick leave, vacation, holidays and other paid leave are considered to be part of the normal workweek and unpaid leave shall not be included as time worked.

8.2 Overtime Compensation

For hours worked in excess of forty in any workweek, one of the following shall occur at the discretion of the employee:

- A. Employee shall accrue compensatory time off on a time-and-one-half basis; or
- B. Overtime shall be paid at time-and-one-half the regular hourly rate of pay.

8.3 Maximum Accumulation of Compensatory Time

The employee may not accrue more than 40 hours of compensatory time-off without permission of the Board President.

We have now entered into a negotiation phase with the surety bond holder, Financial Pacific Insurance Company.

I have attached the letter that FPIC's attorney wrote to KFPD on December 17th and was received on Tuesday, December 21st. In summary, FPIC's stance on this letter is that KFPD was required to inform FPIC of the disparity between Kel-Tec's bid and the estimate for the work. They have also requested a rather large amount of documents related to the project through the Public Records Act.

I have also attached our attorney's response dated December 30th, denying any such applicability of the law that FPIC's attorney cited and continuing to express our desire to resolve this claim promptly. In addition, my response to FPIC's attorney regarding their Public Records Act request is included. At this time, I believe FPIC's legal counsel will be waiting for the requested documents before they proceed with any further correspondence or proposals.

I represent Financial Pacific Insurance Company, which, as you know, is the surety for Kel-Tec Builders, Inc. ("Kel-Tec")

As you also know, Jack Costenbader, of PCA Consulting Group, obtained bids from five contractors to perform the work of Kel-Tec, under the above-referenced contract. Notably, the prices received from these bids were dramatically higher than the bid and contract price of Kel-Tech for the contract.

Were Financial Pacific to pay the difference between the Kel-Tec price and one of these bids, Financial Pacific would be forced to pay as much as the penal sum of its bond. This result seems particularly unfair given that, as demonstrated by said bids, the realistic price for the work was in the \$500,000 range as opposed to the Kel-Tec price of \$268,364. The Kensington Fire Protection District (the "District") would essentially receive over \$500,000 in value for a price of \$268,3654.

We have been informed that the District's estimate of the work was over \$400,000. To my knowledge, the District took no steps to inform Financial Pacific of this huge spread prior to the issuance of performance and payment bonds by Financial Pacific.

An obligee, such as the District, has a duty to inform a surety of facts such as the wide disparity between the engineer's estimate and the Kel-Tec bid price.

This correspondence is in response to your letter of December 17, 2010 regarding the above-referenced project addressed to Brenda J. Navellier, Administrator for the Kensington Fire Protection District. Your letter contains a request for documents pursuant to the California Public Records Act, and references authority regarding the duty of performance bond obligee to disclose certain information to the bond surety.

Our understanding is that Ms. Navellier will respond directly to the request for public documents in a separate correspondence, and this letter responds to the legal contentions in your December 17, 2010 letter. Initially, we appreciate your representation that Financial Pacific is interested in resolving this matter on an amicable basis. Indeed, the District has the same interest. However, we do not agree with your interpretation of the authority cited in your letter. Specifically, you imply that Financial Pacific Insurance Company's obligation on the performance bond may have been discharged because the District did not report the size of the differential in bid amounts on the project to Financial Pacific. In support of this contention, you cite Sumitomo Bank of California v. Iwasaki (1968) 70 Cal.2d 81, which references Restatement of Surety section 124, and discuss a duty of an obligee to disclose facts known by the obligee and unknown to the surety that increase the risk that the surety intended to assume. However, this case is not applicable to the above-referenced project and related performance bond, because Financial Pacific specifically undertook the risk that it would be liable for the \$268,364 penal sum of the bond when it issued the bond. Nothing regarding the amount of bids increased or decreased the risk that Financial Pacific could be liable for this amount, and there is no allegation that the District knew any information that would have made the actual default of the contractor likely. Indeed, the District carefully vetted the Kel-Tec, the principal on the performance bond, during the pre-qualification process and pre-contract discussions.
